POQUOSON CITY PUBLIC SCHOOLS SELECTS NEW ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT

The Poquoson City School Board approved the appointment of Dr. Christine Hill as Poquoson City Public Schools' new Assistant Superintendent of Instruction and Support Services at the School Board meeting on Thursday, July 8, 2021. Dr. Hill began serving in this role on Monday, July 12, filling the position vacated by Dr. Antonia Fox, who was recently appointed as Superintendent of Page County Public Schools.

Dr. Hill has most recently served as the Division Associate Superintendent for Northampton Public Schools. She has also served the Department of Defense Education Activity (DODEA) in roles such as Assistant District Superintendent, Acting Chief of Curriculum, Deputy Chief of Curriculum, and Instructional Systems Specialist. Additionally, Dr. Hill has been a Secondary English Language Arts Coordinator (Williamsburg-James City County Public Schools), Director of Gifted Services (Newport News Public Schools), and building principal (Newport news Public Schools).

Dr. Hill earned her doctorate degree in Education Policy, Planning and Leadership; Administration & Supervision; and Gifted Education/Curriculum & Instruction from the College of William and Mary. She also holds a master's degree from the University of Connecticut and a bachelor's degree from Iowa State University. She began her teaching career in Hawaii as a third grade teacher and has teaching experience as a fourth grade teacher, gifted teacher at the secondary level, remedial math teacher, and adult education instructor.

"Several highly qualified candidates were interviewed for this position and we believe Dr. Hill's experience, training, and skill set make her an ideal fit for Poquoson City Public Schools, especially with her experience working as an Associate Superintendent in a small school division in Virginia.
